1. Program Overview

The Global Education for Innovation and Leadership Program (GEfIL) is an innovative and exciting transdisciplinary undergraduate program launched by the University of Tokyo in 2014 within the framework of Global Leadership Education Programs (GLP). GEfIL is taught entirely in English. The GEfIL courses are designed to equip highly motivated students with the global competency and skills necessary to act internationally and effectively as innovative, responsible team-leaders in a challenging world.

The GLP is comprised of two stages, GLP I and GLP II/ GEfIL (Global Education for Innovation and Leadership).


GLP I is for Year 1 students and GEfIL (GLP II) is for Year 2 students and the Senior Division students. Students who have met the program completion requirements will be conferred a certificate officially issued by the University of Tokyo.

4. Applicant Eligibility

Undergraduate students who fulfill all the requirements below are eligible to apply.

- Students, who entered the University of Tokyo in 2014 (or later). (*Revised on Sept 11th,2015)
 Full-time undergraduate students who entered UTokyo in and before the academic year 2013 will also be accepted.
- 2. Students, who earned or expect to earn 6 credits or more from at least two of the three categories of the GLP I Designated Courses by the end of 2A Semester.
- 3. The University of Tokyo will retrospectively cancel the admission to GEfIL of any student who fails to advance to Year 2.

5. Selection Criteria

Applicants will be screened and selected through a comprehensive process based on the evaluation of the following criteria.

- 1. Students must demonstrate strong interest in playing a leading role internationally in the future.
- 2. Students with a high level of communication skills in English and thus able to keep up with the GEfIL classes in English, communicate with professors and other students while studying abroad and so on. In principle, an IELTS score of 7.0 or TOEFL iBT score of 100 is required to be accepted. However, students with a score slightly below the above requirement will also be considered for admission and their English proficiency will be evaluated comprehensively through the application documents and the interview.
- 3. The following factors will also be taken into account.
 - Strong interest in pursuing leading roles in international community (e.g. acquisition of two foreign languages or more)
 - Excellence in academic grades for the Junior Division of College of Arts and Sciences
- High motivation and capability to participate in the GEfIL Program in addition to your studies at the Senior Division.

6. Application Procedures

All documents should be written in English.

 - When submitting the hardcopy application documents, they must be printed single-sided on size A4 paper.
 - Applicants are requested to initially submit their completed Application Form and Grading Coefficient Table electronically to the address below, and then print, sign and mail or bring their Application Form to the GLP Office along with the Academic Transcript and TOEFL/IELTS Score Record.

 - Students who meet the requirement below are exempted from submission of the score record. Please describe your background or educational history in the designated space of the application form. If you have any concerns about your eligibility, please consult with the Center for the Development of Global Leadership Education via a relevant section of the College of Arts and Sciences.

[English Proficiency Requirement]

Students who have received an English-medium education for at least 5 years of the first 6 years of education and at least 5 years of the next 6 years of education are exempt from submitting English proficiency test scores.

7. Selection Process

- 1. Selection for admission is based on the evaluation of the application documents and interview.
- 2. Interviews are conducted only with those applicants, who pass the document assessment in the first stage. Interview notification will be sent to the eligible students via email by Friday, October 9. No email notification will be sent to unsuccessful applicants. Interviews conducted in English are scheduled between Tuesday, October 13 and Friday, November 20 in general and will last about 20 minutes. The GLP Office will assign one specific date and time to each student, who has passed the first document assessment, while considering the student's availability.
- 3. Selection result of the interview will be emailed to all interviewees in early December.
